Priority 4: WesternIllinois University Stipes Hall Renovatio Stipes Hall was constructed in 1968 and has had no major renovations or updates. The University through is the Macomb Facilities Master Plan update and Strategic Building Renovat Matrix has identified building as a priority for renovation. The building is a high profile, heavily used part of the academic programs on campus and it also has a high deferred maintenance backlog.

Priority 5: WesterrIllinois University-Education BuildingHorrabin Hall was originally constructed in 1965 as a laboratory school and encompassed 12 grades. The needs of the College of Education and Human Services do not match the curre building construction. This project would reconstruct the building on the siteroal Hall.

These facilities were constructed before modern detatory standards were developed by the American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air-Condtioning Engineers Western Illinois University science facilities fall below acceptable indoor air quality resembly efficiency standard The antiquated labratory fume hood systems and poor quality heating, ventilation, and air conditioning systems yill inadequate comfort and humidity control. This problem produces bremely detrimental impactor teaching, research and student/faculty/staff recruitmental retention.
