Julia Albarracin, Chair; Everett Hamne/fice Chair; Denise Gravitt, Secretary Mark Mossman, InterinProvost; Jeremy Robinett, Parliamentarian; Annette Hamm, Faculty Senate Office Manager Parliamentarian Robinteesked if this information has already been collected by the deans. Interim Provost Mossman replied that for the past year and a battor have been made to try to get responses from faculty on ways to generate revenue and enrollment growth, but not is aware of any document where all of these responses have been compiled. He thinks revenue generation is crucial, and it is important to try to get the entire university involved in these discussions.

Senator Hamner asked about the format for the attChair Albarracin responded that the faculty representatives will have a very limited amount of time to speak.
